Wrightstown Campus

Serving Students Preschool to 12th Grade



Desert Christian Elementary at the Wrightstown Campus offers a vibrant and nurturing environment for students from preschool through 6th grade, set on 16 scenic acres with captivating views of the Catalina Mountains. With an enrollment of 269 children, the campus is characterized by a strong sense of community and growth.

The school has benefited from substantial facility improvements, ensuring that students have enriching spaces in which to learn and grow.

Students at DCES enjoy a diverse array of educational experiences, including Specials such as Music, Art, PE, Spanish, Symphonic Orchestra, and Discipleship, as well as after-school opportunities in Robotics and Drama. Sixth graders are able to participate in middle school sports like Flag Football, Volleyball, Basketball, Softball, and Soccer, enhancing their development through athletics and teamwork.

Guided by a dedicated administration and staff, the campus remains committed to fostering a Christ-centered learning environment enriched by opportunities for creativity, personal growth, and community engagement. stands out for its unwavering commitment to quality teaching, a biblically integrated curriculum, and highly relational teachers who foster meaningful connections with their students each day. EXCEPTIONAL STUDENT PROGRAM

At Desert Christian Schools, it is considered to be a true blessing to offer support to students with disabilities and their families through the Exceptional Student Services (ESS) program which currently serves approximately 12% of DCS total student population.

DCS firmly believes that every student is a unique creation made in the image of God (Genesis 1:27) and fearfully and wonderfully made (Psalm 139:14), possessing a multitude of strengths. This belief serves as the foundation for staff as they provide unwavering support to students, ensuring they receive a Chris-centered education that nurtures their intellectual growth, spiritual development, and social skills (Luke 2:52).

The ESS program collaborates closely with students, teachers, and families to develop Individualized Accommodation Plans or Exceptional Student Plans, catering to a wide range of disabilities including Specific Learning Disabilities, Attention Deficit/Hyperactivity Disorder, High Functioning Autism, Emotional Disorders, and more. These tailored plans are implemented through an inclusive approach, where students primarily participate in general education classrooms while receiving assistance from an ESS co-teacher within the class or through dedicated services provided in the ESS room.

ARTS

Performing and Visual Arts

Art education at Desert Christian teaches elements and principles of art through a variety of media to explore a child's creativity. Reinforcement of learning is supported by school, and local exhibits. Artwork completed during the year may be seen displayed in classrooms, the school office and public spaces, and through contests such as the regional ASCI showcase and Arizona's Young Illustrators/Artists Competition.

Drama

Expressing oneself effectively is vital to communicating and relating. As part of a traditional liberal arts education, students are prepared to speak articulately and correctly. Drama and public speaking can be powerfully used for sharing God's truths. Classes in drama, musical theatre, and spring plays afford students the opportunity to share their God-given talents to glorify Him and further discover His calling for their lives. Desert High School students also learn to speak well and express their thoughts creatively through various class projects and extra-curricular offerings, such as Mock Trial and the Shakespeare Festival. The annual DCS Speech Meet and Discipleship classes, showcase middle schoolers and their ability display their burgeoning talent for public speaking and drama as well.

Music

Music is an integral part of Scripture as praise for God's many blessings is expressed throughout the Bible. From the preschool to the high school, Desert Christian Schools integrates biblical truth into its music offerings in order to encourage students to use music as a means to know, love, and serve Jesus Christ. For example, the youngest students are introduced to scripture memorization through weekly Chapel verses set to song and music that it may be ever-impressed upon their hearts. Whether performing with hand bells, ensemble, or Christmas concert, music and singing allows students to more fully know the wonders of God, to realize His love for them, and to worship Him personally.

THE OPPORTUNITY

HEAD OF SCHOOLS

Desert Christian Schools is seeking a Head of Schools who will serve as an authentic leader, closely partnering with the Board of Trustees to drive school success across academic and operational domains. The ideal candidate possesses deep instructional expertise, models spiritual maturity and discernment, and is dedicated to fostering a vibrant faith-based learning environment. Daily priorities include advancing the school's mission, guiding and evaluating personnel, nurturing a Christ-centered educational atmosphere, and securing essential resources need to continue the momentum. Visibility and active engagement within the community are paramount, with the Head of Schools expected to be a consistent presence at events and a reliable steward in all executive functions. This role requires high moral character, professional competence, and a commitment to both academic excellence and the unique covenantal values of Desert Christian Schools.

Strategic foresight and a continuous growth mindset underpin the leadership expectations for this position. The Head of Schools is responsible for forming strong partnerships with local churches and the broader community, building bridges that amplify the school's impact and unite diverse stakeholders in a shared mission. This leader inspires others, empowers staff, and invests proactively in the school's future, ensuring lasting excellence by championing innovation and maintaining high standards. Key responsibilities include evaluating instructional methods, leading professional development, and pursuing academic benchmarks. Through transparent communication, collaborative decision-making, and steadfast ethical leadership, the Head of Schools reinforces Desert Christian Schools' Christ-centered ethos, adeptly managing administrative and policy challenges to keep the school aligned with its biblical foundation and pursuit of educational distinction.



THEROLE

The Desert Christian Schools, Head of Schools (HOS), is the Chief Executive Officer of the school and, as such, holds full responsibility for all aspects of the school's operation. The office of Head of Schools has as its primary purpose to provide leadership of the school in order to achieve the fullest attainment of the mission of Desert Christian Schools. The HOS is appointed by the School Board and is the sole employee of the School Board.

The Head of Schools of Desert Christian Schools is a person of deep Christian faith. The Head of Schools' primary responsibility is to be the spiritual leader of Desert Christian Schools and to communicate and promote Christian Values throughout the school community, including staff, students and parents. The HOS is directly responsible for the external affairs of the school, for ensuring sufficient resources, sound fiscal management and financial stability of the school through direct oversight of the business operations, development, alumni, community relations and enrollment management activities – collaboratively supports and encourages the Administration Leadership Team of 3 principals and 4 directors. The Head of Schools promotes the good reputation and values of the school in acting as the primary liaison between the school and School Board.



SPIRITUAL DUTIES AND DEVELOPMENT

- Ensure a biblical worldview is incorporated as it pertains to instruction.
- Lead the school as a servant-leader, understanding DCS serves a diverse community with varying needs.
- Partner with local churches and network within the greater Tucson community to broaden the impact and visibility of the school.
- Utilize interpersonal skills to mediate and navigate disagreements, concerns, and challenges brought by members of the DCS community.
- To the extent it is possible, attend student and school-wide events to be a visible presence for families (e.g., chapel, awards nights, open houses, school-wide parent meetings, athletics, fine arts, and others).
- Spend time with the student body and be visible, approachable, and interested in them.

ADMINISTRATIVE DUTIES AND DEVELOPMENT

- Strive to maintain positive working relationships with parents, students, staff, faculty churches, businesses, other schools (private, Christian, charter, home and public), donors, and the community at large.
- Provide an updated strategic plan annually (including issues regarding personnel, budget, facilities, curriculum, and co-curricular activities).
- Ensure that all school practices, activities, decisions, and/or organizational circumstances are lawful, prudent, and in compliance with commonly accepted business and professional ethics, as well as all Desert Christian School statements.
- Maintain a safe and secure school environment at all times.
- Consistently and strategically communicate with the entire DCS community (students, families, and employees).
- Inform and support the work of the BOT, which shall include providing monthly reports to the BOT.
- Provide adequate protection and maintenance for all school assets, avoiding unnecessary risks.

EDUCATIONAL DUTIES AND DEVELOPMENT

- Strive to maintain a high level of competence in the field of education, remaining current on issues relating to education.
- Supervise education and instructional practices, including curriculum development.
- Ensure rules, policies, and procedures are in place so that employees, students, and volunteers can function effectively and efficiently.
- Oversee the systematic implementation of the major recommendations submitted by the ACSI accreditation team.
- Ensure that the programs and services of the school meet or exceed school and/or accreditation standards.
- Represent the larger DCS community at all relevant external organizations pertaining to private schools, school-choice events, and Christian schools.



FINANCIAL DUTIES AND DEVELOPMENT

- Formulate an annual budget, in collaboration with the BOT Treasurer, and the school CFO to present it to the BOT for approval.
- Work with the Finance Committee and Business office to make sound fiscal decisions to monitor and stay within the annual budget.
- Provide the BOT Treasurer and direct reports with proper financial statements in the handling of all monies for DCS.
- Anticipate and forecast any budget shortfalls in revenue or overages in expenses and present an immediate corrective action plan to the BOT.
- Cultivate and maintain major donor relationships and seek alternative assets, endowments, and income streams.

PERSONNEL DUTIES AND DEVELOPMENT

- Supervise the evaluation of employees using formal and informal evaluation and meet with them to communicate feedback. Monitor the implementation of performance improvement plans.
- Use a 360 Evaluation tool for feedback that provides areas for self-improvement.
- Hold school school administration accountable for instructional excellence as well as
 policy and procedure follow through.
- Work alongside/coach administrators in the supervision of employees.
- Provide employees with opportunities to take on new challenges and leadership roles.
- Model consistent and expedient communication with parents and ensure school staff does the same.
- Respect professional ethics (confidentiality regarding personal information about students, parents, or employees).





WELCOME TO TUCSON, ARIZONA

- Tucson is a unique desert town, two hours south of Phoenix, that pretends to still be a small cowboy town even though the population is well over one million. The city vibe is one of laid back and relaxed, probably due to the very hot summers (100+ degrees), though not as hot as Phoenix to the north.
- The area is known for a number of unique characteristics: one of the highest number of days of sunshine each year, beautiful vistas and sunsets throughout the year, amazing winter weather (that makes the summer heat bearable), outdoor activities galore (hiking, walking, cycling, swimming, golf, tennis, pickleball) year round, the annual rodeo and rodeo parade, and the tour d' Tucson an annual 100+ mile bike ride/race around the city's perimeter.
- The presence of the University of Arizona brings a college flavor to the city's core with its huge campus and med school, NCAA basketball, football, baseball, and softball; and a collection of museums unrivaled by many larger metro areas.
- The city has 6-8 Christian schools, though Desert Christian on the east side of town and Pusch Ridge on the northwest side are the two largest of those schools which stimulates a healthy rivalry in sports and a good natured competition, though connection and collaboration is the key word with all the school's leaders in the city.
- Tucson is one of the driest cities in the US with humidity hovering in the single digits for much of the year, making for the well known "dry heat" which can make a 100 plus degree day feel tolerable. It is wonderful for those with breathing issues and allergies, being a destination for many escaping the high humidity areas of the country.
- From Tucson it is only 40 minutes up to Mt Lemmon at 9000 plus feet, an hour and half to phoenix for their airport and sporting / arts events, 5 hours to the coast at San Diego, and a 4 hour drive north to the high country forests of Flagstaff and the Grand Canyon.
